I and the two (2) Members of the PRBoA, namely Architect (Ar) Angeline T. Chua Chiaco and Ar Marietta B. Segovia, congratulate the United Architects of the Philippines (UAP), the integrated and accredited professional organization of architects (IAPoA) under Republic Act (R.A.) No. 9266 (The Architecture Act of 2004), specifically its Convention Director, Ar Henry Steve R. Olonan; the Executive Director for its Commission on Convention & Conferences, Ar Robert T. Ong; and the National President, Ar Ana S. Mangalino-Ling, on the occasion of the 36th UAP National Convention and Convention Exhibits (ConEx) 2010, with the theme "UAP at the Forefront of Green Building and Sustainability".

The PRBoA also extends its felicitations to the honored Guests and to the friends and supporters of all the UAP members in attendance.

To help protect our natural and built environments from the predatory, if not illegal development practices of unscrupulous entities who only aim to protect their selfish interests at the expense of higher public interest, the UAP and its general membership are doubly urged to be very participative at the local government unit (LGU) level so that the value of the

UAP member can be properly appreciated by their host communities/LGUs. Always remember that registered and licensed architect (RLA) is the primary State-regulated professional who must lead in physical plan and design compliances with the Building Code (P.D. No. 1096), the Fire Code (R.A. No. 9514), the Accessibility Law (B.P. No. 344) and related laws that are all intended to make residences, housing and buildings/structures safer, secure, healthy and survivable in times of disaster.

This may include not only the performance of voluntary civic activities, including advisory services on Green Buildings and Sustainable Design practices, that can considerably help in the improvement of the local natural and built environments (possibly on a qualified gratis basis). This may even include the active involvement of the UAP or its Areas/Districts/Chapters or of any individual UAP Member as an official Bid and Award Committee (BAC) Observer under R.A. No. 9184 (The 2003 Government Procurement Reform Act/ GPRR) and its July 2009 IRR.

With the UAP as the IAPoA, it is the PRBoA's express and continuing desire that many more areas of cooperation between the PRBoA and the UAP, particularly through its National Board of Directors (NBD), its Executive Committee (ExCom) and its Areas, Districts and Chapters, shall be opened (or shall remain open) in the remaining/upcoming UAP fiscal year/s, and that these are kept evolving and moving forward in order to help attain our shared primary goal of the full implementation and enforcement of R.A. No. 9266, its implementing rules and regulations (IRR) and derivative regulations, particularly in light of our many recent and historic victories in arenas of public governance and administration of justice. It is also the continuing wish of the PRBoA that it shall be able to receive the full and continuing UAP support, locally and internationally, on the current and future PRBoA initiatives toward this end.

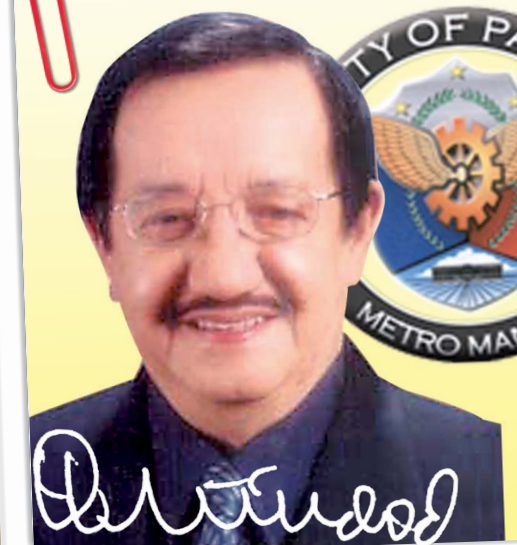

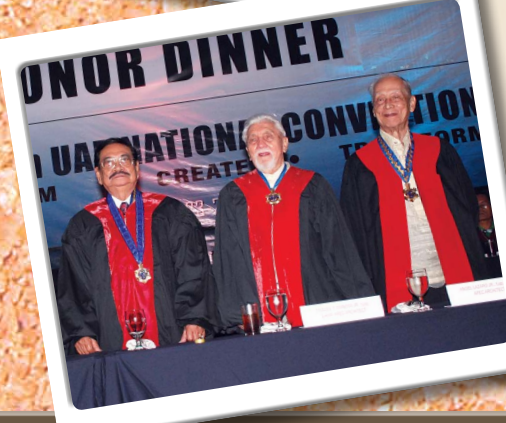

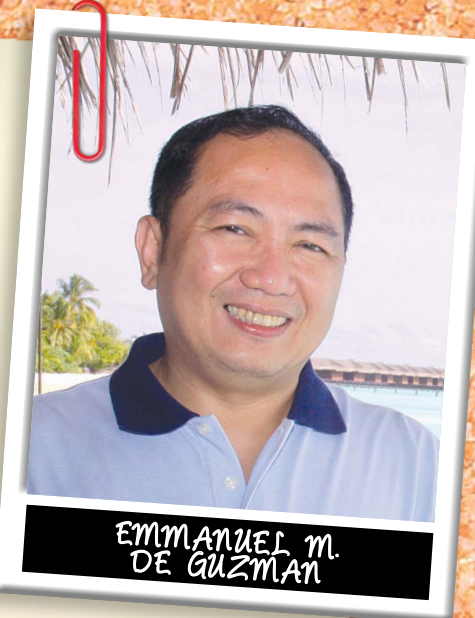

(Part of IRR of the R.A. No. 9266 - The Architecture Act of 2004)

ABSTRACT of LECTURE

As our world becomes expansive, inside-outside spaces, aesthetics, the environment and products of technology becomes part of our basic shelter needs. Inevitably the demands on the architectural profession have expanded into a broader context due to the need of continuity of requirements of the "inside" and the "outside" of buildings. Architects, with their wide-range academic training, mandatory apprenticeship and licensure examination, are most qualified to explore the realm of specialized architectural services. Within each of the Specialized Architectural Services, the basic responsibility of an Architect to "...man and society... to make sure that both the building and its physical environment can enhance the lives of people by strictly adhering to national and international standards with regard to public health, safety and welfare" is the framework by which these Specialized Architectural Services are rendered. As part of R.A. No. 9266 and its 2004 IRR are the following but not limited to: (1.) Architectural Interiors (2.) Acoustic Design (3.) Architectural Lighting Layout and Design (4.) Architectural Landscape Layout (5.) Site and Physical Planning (6.) Comprehensive and Master Planning (7.) Historic and Cultural Heritage Conservation and Planning (8.) Security Evaluation and Planning (9.) Building Systems Design (10.) Facilities Maintenance Support (11.) Building Commissioning (12.) Building Environmental Certification (13.) Forensic Architecture (14.) Building Appraisal (15.) Structural Conceptualization (16.) Preliminary Services (17.) Contract Documentation and Review (18.) Post-Design Services (including Construction Management Services) (19.) Dispute Avoidance and Resolution (20.) Architectural Research Methods (21.) Special Building/ Facility Planning and Design (22.) Building Components (23.) Management Architectural Practices

Luis also served as the Chancellor of the UAP College of Fellows in 2004-2005 and continues to serve the UAP in various capacities – as a member of the Ad Hoc Committee now updating, upgrading and rewriting the Standards for Professional Practice for Architects in charge of UAP Document 202; as Corporate Secretary of the Board of Trustees of the UAP Foundation; and as Chairman of the Monitoring Committee of the APEC Architects Registry, Philippine Section. She is the Secretary General for 2009 and 2010 of the APEC Architect Project Central Council, with a membership of 14 economies.

Arch. Luis was awarded Professional of the Year in the Field of Architecture in 1999 by the PRC and is one of the first 12 Filipino architects awarded the title of APEC Architect in October 2006.

'SELECTION OF THE ARCHITECT & METHODS OF COMPENSATION'

The UAP National Administration in the year 2007 created the Standards of Professional Practice (SPP) Committee Chaired by Arch. Edric Marco Florentino, the past UAP National President. The aim of this working group is to upgrade the UAP Document Nos. 200 to 201 series since the reference documents of Architects are already out dated. The group meets on Tuesdays at the UAP National Headquarters to talk about the amendments of the Code. As much as possible, the integrity of the original documents way back in 1975 is retained. But the committee finds it necessary to modify and improve some portions of the document to keep up with the Architects' needs of the time. After careful deliberations, the Committee Chair submitted already most of the completed SPP Documents with amendments to the Professional Regulation Commission- Board of Architecture (PRBoA). Once approved by both parties the UAP and PRBoA, such documents will now be submitted to the PRC Legal Council for approval. After going through with the legal process, the UAP Standards of Professional Practice the 200 series will be ready for implementation.

"SELECTION OF THE ARCHITECT AND METHODS OF COMPENSATION" is UAP Doc. 208. This article discusses how an Architect can acquire a Client and undertake architectural projects. There are three general classifications namely: Direct Selection, Comparative Selection and Design Competition. In the performance of his duties and responsibilities in which way he is leveling the playing field, the Architect may offer services he is capable of such as Pre-Design Services, Design Services, Specialized and Allied Services, Construction Services, Post-Construction Services, Comprehensive Architectural Services and Design-Build Services.

From the Code of Ethical Conduct: "The profession of Architecture calls for men of the highest integrity, judgment, business capacity and artistic and technical ability." To achieve this goal, the Architect's National Code is divided into two, the Code of Ethical Conduct and the Standards of Professional Practice which serves as the guiding light to all practitioners of the profession.

'PRE-DESIGN SERVICES' 'STANDARD GUIDELINES ON CONSULTING SERVICES'

Norberto M. Nuke is a shining beacon of integrity. In a time and place when the architecture profession was in the dawn of recognition, once made chaotic with multifarious views and uncertain loyalties, it was Bert Nuke, as he is fondly known, who led the group that took on an unenviable task. To unite the many talented yet opposing architectural minds of the country into a collection of professionals suffused with intellect and civility is a feat that only Bert Nuke can achieve.

Before the time of the United Architects of the Philippines, an architect had either of two demeanors towards the profession: one of apathy, or one of discontent. Those who were apathetic belonged to no group. Those who were discontent convened into factions which began as splinter groups, with its members brought together by dissatisfaction with the organization left behind.

The time came, however, when even the most disparate of personalities agreed that such disfunction had to cease. There were a number of people capable of leading, but it was Bert Nuke who was chosen. With his steadfast and clear-headed leadership, he served as what is known as the Interim President / Charter President of the United Architects of the Philippines. It was Bert Nuke who guided the transition from a position of dissent, to a standing of integrity, a stature that the United Architects of the Philippines (UAP) holds today.

It was under Bert Nuke's headship that the UAP became the first professional organization accredited by the Professional Regulation Commission. Bert Nuke was the one who administered the oath to the first batch of UAP members, thus initiating a well-established tradition that every architect of the country now automatically becomes a part of.

He established the system that made UAP self-sustaining: the appointment of regional coordinators and committee chairpersons across the breadth of the country. It made coordination easier by creating hubs and conduits of communication that architects could easily access, as they need only approach the UAP coordinator of their locality to be connected to the whole.

'COMPREHENSIVE SERVICES'

A graduate of the U.P. College of Architecture in 1982, Armin also holds an MBA Degree from the U.P. College of Business Administration, where he finished at the top of the UP MBA Day Program Class of 1985. He also topped the Real Estate Brokers Licensure Examinations on the same year. His architectural work includes the design of a number of institutional buildings, among which are the College or Nursing at UERMMMC, the Phase 7 extension of the U.P. College of Public Administration, and the U.P. Integrated School K-2 building. Armin has also had experience as a micro developer where he designed, built and sold homes in Metro Manila. During the early nineties, he was Editor-Publisher of the Real Estate Investors' Guide, a monthly publication which tracked local real estate prices.

Arch. Sarthou has held positions in various professional organizations, among which are the United Architects of the Philippines (UAP) where he served as Chapter President of the Diliman Chapter from 1994-96. In this capacity, he put together numerous Continuing Professional Education seminars which formed the backbone of Diliman's strong thrust into academic service for the practicing professional. He was Director for District A-4 from 1996-97, and again in 1999-2000. He was Secretary General of the organization from 2000-2001 and held the position of National Executive Vice President from 2001-2002. Presently, he is the Vice Chancellor of the UAP College of Fellows. He teaches at the U.P. College of Architecture, where he handles such subjects as design, professional practice, presentation techniques, research methods, and land reform, finance and taxation.

'CONTINUOUS GREEN EMERGING POSSIBILITIES IN ECOLOGICAL ARCHITECTURE'

Can principals of organic growth act as a basis for design of our constructed landscapes? As cities expand, surrounding natural landscapes are compromised as forests are cleared, fields paved over and watersheds subverted. All too often, urban development demands a corresponding reduction in open green spaces and natural habitats. Yet, opportunities exist to re-imagine an expanding built environment as the integration of inorganic human systems within an ever-evolving ecological context. Recent projects by Dr. Ken Yeang and his Kuala Lumpur-based firm, T. R. Hamzah & Yeang, are presented as expressions of this possibility. With densely vegetated façades, comprehensive strategies for water management, climatically-responsive

design and innovative vertical green concepts, they envision urban development as ecological armature, striving to enhance existing ecosystems, rather than replace them.

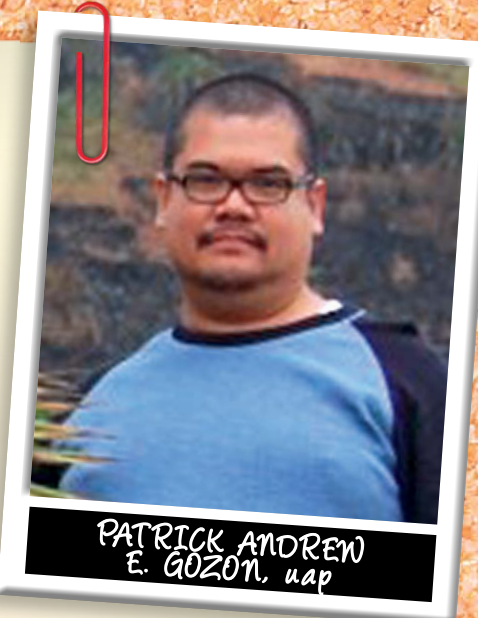
Solaris, a 16 story office and research development currently under construction in Singapore will be presented in more detail as a case study in ecological building design. Solaris has been awarded BCA's GreenMark Platinum rating, the highest possible green building certification granted by Singapore's sustainable building benchmark (eg. LEED, GBI, BREEAM, etc..). The project includes several innovative green features including a massive diagonal solar shaft, a basement eco-cell and an uninterrupted 1.5 km spiral landscaped ramp that connects ground level parks with the cascading sequence of roof-gardens at the building's highest levels. With over 8000 square meters of landscaping, Solaris introduces vegetated areas that exceed the area of the building's original site.

'EVALUATION OF SELECTED PHILIPPINE NATIVE TREES & SHRUBS FOR LANDSCAPE DESIGN USE'

The research aspires to explore the design viability of selected species of Philippine native trees and shrubs for landscape architecture use. It would attempt to enumerate some 70 pertinent native species and evaluate their physical attributes in terms of aesthetics and perceived landscape value. It would also try to document the cultural importance of the said species and utilize them as guidelines for use in Philippine landscape design. The result would be a documentation of the selected Philippine native trees and shrubs with their highlighted landscape material potential. The information would include distribution, physical attributes, cultural value and the translated landscape architecture application.

Patrick is a licensed architect, UAP Makati Chapter. He took up his B.S. in Architecture in U.P. Diliman. He recently finished his thesis on 'Native trees and Shrubs for Landscape Design Use' and will graduate with a Masteral Degree in Tropical Landscape Architecture on April 25, 2010, also from U.P. 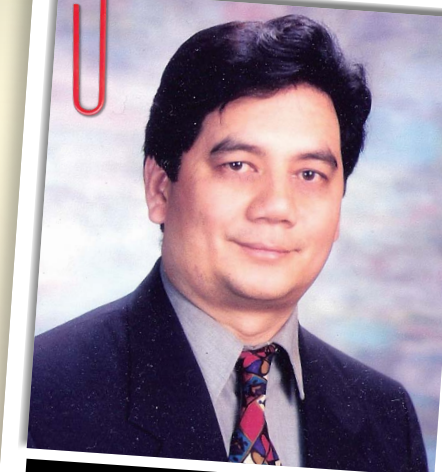

'GREEN WALLS + GREEN ROOFS: VEGETATING THE BUILDING ENVELOPE'

A healthy, sustainable designed environment must have a balance of the three groups: people, vegetation and wildlife. A great disruption in our ecology consequently leads to many of our environmental health problems. In urban areas, buildings are replacing plants once growing on the ground that they are now occupying causing ecological imbalance, urban heat island effect, increased flooding and other environmental disruptions. Since our cities are already dominated by infrastructures, barren pavements and limited ground for planting, what do we do to put more plants back? In this report, we present ways and possibilities on how plants are integrated to the building envelope. Symbiotically, as the building becomes a habitat for other living things, plants in turn insulate and protect the building and its inhabitants from heat, rain and pollution.

While there is an occurrence of plants growing naturally on buildings, there are various greening techniques that hasten the plant covering on buildings such as the application of green walls and green roofs. The choice of plants and technology to use will be dependent on a variety of factors such as the climatic conditions, building design, structural load, budget, and specific uses that need to be achieved.

Profile

Grace C. Edralin-Servino is a graduate of bachelor of science in architecture with a masters degree on tropical landscape architecture at the University of the Philippines Diliman where she also works as a University Research Associate since 2001. With her background in these two fields of study, she become fascinated with the integration of both elements of architecture and landscape architecture. She started researching on green roofs and green walls since 2006 and has been involved in projects of designing and evaluating several experiments using selected plant species and materials to come up with vegetated modules applicable in the local setting. She continues to study and apply various technologies including the imported systems being introduced in the market. She hopes to improve the Philippine environment by greening more buildings with the use of plants, encouraging more people to do so and particularly challenging more Filipino architects to consider this in their designed projects.

"MANILA PLAN OF 1905: SOURCES AND INFLUENCES THAT MADE THE CITY BEAUTIFUL BY DANIEL BURNHAM"

About the Author

Dr. Joshua R. T. Roxas earned his Ph.D. degree in Architecture on September 2009 with the field of specialization in urban planning and history at The University of Tokyo with his dissertation "Manila Plan of 1905: Sources and Influences that Made the City Beautiful by Daniel Burnham". His research on "Plazas in Manila: A Spanish Origin in Transformation" earned him his Master of Engineering degree Major in Architecture in the same university. He was Monbukagakusho scholar for postgraduate studies in Japan from year 2002 until 2008. He was member of the Architectural Institute of Japan while studying in Tokyo. Prior to his postgraduate studies, he was a practicing architect as well as an educator and taught architectural courses at Far Eastern University. He gained his Certificate in Fine Arts Major in Visual Communication and Bachelor of Science in Architecture at the University of the Philippines.

About the Presentor

Arch. Dino S. Delotavo gained his Master of Engineering degree Major in Architecture in the field of environmental psychology in 2007 at The University of Tokyo as a Monbukagakusho scholar for postgraduate studies in Japan. He finished his undergraduate degree in architecture at the University of the Philippines. Presently, he is connected with DDC Architects in Sydney, Australia and Cadiz International Manila.

About the Research

The research aims to discover Daniel Burnham's innovation in planning and how Burnham's proposal for Manila was translated by the people responsible for its implementation. The study traces the roots of Burnham's knowledge in designing some of the great cities in America and eventually Manila despite of his lack of formal education in planning and design. The Manila Plan of 1905 as the first comprehensive plan of the city is the fusion of Burnham's experience and knowledge. Burnham combined the elements of Paris and the physical aspects of the city as influenced by Ecole de Beaux-Arts graduates. During the formative years of city planning, Burnham's innovation was to consider the city as a whole for each member of the society. He designed the civic center for the government officials; street system for the businessmen; and park system for the citizenry. After Burnham's visit and study of the physical features of Manila, Spanish style was recommended to harmonize with the existing architecture of the city. Based on what they saw and learned in America, the U.S. educated Filipinos equated and used classicism as the architecture of City Beautiful in Manila which contradicted Burnham's original intention. Effort was made to strictly follow Burnham's proposal but awareness of the consequence that implementing the plan as specified would disrupt the established part of the city hindered the full implementation of certain elements plan. The research identifies Daniel Burnham and the U.S. educated Filipinos as instrumental in bringing the good intentions as well as the defects of Beaux-Arts principles in architecture and planning to Manila.

THE MIMAROPA REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN'

Our lecture for today is a man with diverse talents and interests. He is an environmentalist cum ecologist, an educator, a debater, an excellent lecturer and of course, he represents the ideal middle manager in the bureaucracy such as the Environmental Management Bureau.

Like many middle managers in the bureaucracy, he will not be where he is today had he not planned his life well. With a magna cum laude to crown his Bachelor of Science in Education, major in English, he found his niche in the world of environmental development and management by being an educator first in the Universidad De Zamboanga and then to the prestigious boys' school, Don Bosco Technical School in Makati. Then, he became an Associate Researcher at the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA). His work assignment in NEDA for 14 years was focused not only on trade and industry but also on the budding field of environment. Inspired by his work, he took up courses on environmental impact assessment at the University of the Philippines in Diliman and later finished his Master of Arts in Urban and Regional Planning, also in UP Diliman. Immediately thereafter, he took up his Ph.D. in UP Diliman, this time as TDI-USAID scholar. Today, he is one of the fewest licensed Environmental and Natural Resources.

In the meantime, as part time professor, he taught Classical Literature at Miriam College in Quezon City and Real Estate and Environmental Planning at the Graduate School of Saint Benilde, Dela Salle University-Taft, Manila. He is also a part time lecturer in the graduate school of International Academy for Economics and Management on Strategic Planning and Global Scanning and at UP College of Engineering, Diliman, Quezon City. Aside from being a part-time lecturer, he is also a resource speaker of the Pollution Control Association of the Philippines Inc. (PCAPI), Development Academy of the Philippines (DAP), Local Government Academy and DENR-CENRO Academy.
